

Goutami Eye Institute (GEI) is a registered not-for-profit organization established in Rajahmundry during the year 2005 in terms of the A.P. Societies Registration Act, under the Chairmanship of Dr. VK Raju MD, FRCS, FACS, a US based world renowned Ophthalmologist, Regional Eye Associates; President and Founder, Eye Foundation of America; President and Founder, Goutami Eye Institute; Clinical Professor, West Virginia University, Director, International Ocular Surface Society; Adjunct Professor, GSL Medical School, Adjunct Professor, Wilmer Eye Institute, Johns Hopkins University. The other Members of the Governing Board are Mr. M. Siva Subba Rao, Leading Advocate; Mr. V.V. Kumar, Formerly Vice President, Nagarjuna Group; Mr. Narayya Choudary, Leading Automobile Businessman; Mr. Prasad Chundru, Leading Businessman in Holograms; Mr. Tondepu V. Hanumantarao, Philanthropist; and Dr.Leela Raju, Associate Professor in Ophthalmology, New York University, USA. The day to day affairs are looked after by the MD Mr. V.V. Kumar and CMO Dr. Y. Srinivas Reddy.

We are exempted under Sec.12 (A) and Sec.80 (G) of the Income Tax Act.

We at Goutami, work with the goal of eliminating avoidable blindness and providing high quality ophthalmic care which is affordable and accessible to all, and ultimately educate the general public about the need for proper eye care and awareness about debilitating eye diseases. We provide highly specialized facilities in Eye care, in all the sub specialties viz., Cataract, Retina, Glaucoma, Neuro-ophthalmology, Paediatric Ophthalmology, Cornea Services and Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP), free of cost to the underprivileged and at affordable prices to other patients at the ratio of 60:40.

GEI was formed with an urge to eliminate avoidable blindness under the guiding principles of:

- Service :- To eliminate avoidable blindness, prevention being the paramount.
- Education :- To educate the public on eye care and injury prevention.

 The local teachers are taught how to screen for early eye problems in children
- Medical and surgical interventions: To protect, preserve, and restore eye sight through caring service, irrespective of socio-economic status, with emphasis on education and research.

Activities of GEI



GEI has signed a MOU with Sri Sringeri Sharada Peetham Charitable Trust, Sringeri on 1st January 2021 to construct, establish and run a charitable eye care unit as a joint venture for the poor and downtrodden



As a part of our community service, Goutami Eye Institute has distributed nose-masks to the general public during January 2021 (second wave of Covid-19) to protect the health of poor and needy.



World Glaucoma Week was conducted from 7th to 13th March, 2021. As a part of this event, an awareness camp was also organized at Sri Virinchi Vanaprastha Ashramam, Rajahmundry for the benefit of local public including the residents of old age home. Free screening was conducted for their benefit while highlighting the awareness on Glaucoma and its related blindness.



Inaugurated "Mobile Eye Clinic Services" in Gokavaram village on July 5th, 2021. These services are available every Monday at Gokavaram on a regular basis for the poor and needy of this village and the surrounding villages including tribal areas.



Similarly, "Mobile Eye Clinic Services" were inaugurated at Korukonda village also on July 6th, 2021. These services are available on every Tuesday at Korukonda and the surrounding villages.



"Zeiss Lumera i" Surgical microscope was inaugurated by Rtn. M. Rama Rao, Rotary International 3020 District Governor on 22nd September 2021. This equipment was obtained with the financial assistance from the Rotary Global Grant.



Community Outreach programs

As a part of our Community Outreach Programs, we conduct camps in the nooks and corners of the State of Andhra Pradesh and transport the patients to the base hospital in our buses, provide them free lodging & boarding and transport them back to their locations after treatment. The post-operative follow up is also carried out at their respective places of residences in towns/villages. We also give them post-operative medicines and spectacles free of cost. Since the inception till date we have examined about 7 lakhs out-patients and have performed about 60,000 surgical procedures. Further, as our dream is to strive for a "World"



without Childhood Blindness", we screened about 7 lakhs school children, provided about 13,000 corrective glasses and also performed surgeries when needed. Eye camps are conducted with a dedicated fully air-conditioned Mobile Eye Clinic (an Ophthalmic Van) which is equipped with LCD Vision Chart, Lens Set (Trial Set), Retinoscope, Slit Lamp plus 90D lens, Auto Refractometer, Chair Unit, Fundus Camera, Perkins Tonometer, Indirect Ophthalmoscope, Auto Lens Meter, Examination bed etc. This equipment is used to screen Refractive errors, Cataract, Glaucoma and Diabetic Retinopathy eye problems in patients. This Mobile Eye Clinic is meant exclusively for community screening. Patients screened and identified for eye problems at these camps are brought to the Base Hospital for further treatment in our own vehicles. During their stay at Base Hospital, they are provided with free food and accommodation, not only to the patient but also to one attendant. After surgical intervention they are provided with free medication and spectacles. These patients are dropped back at their respective villages. Postoperative care is also provided 'free of cost'. Most of these patients are elderly women and/or daily wage earners. The infrastructure at base hospital includes dedicated wards and staff for these woman patients.




Vision for Children: School Going Children – Vision Screening Program

VISION Screening of school going children is one of the early detection programs that we initiated in line with our dream project of "A World without Childhood Blindness" in tune with our core value i.e. Elimination of Avoidable Blindness in Childhood and beyond.

Though we started screening of school children in 2005-06 itself, we realised

the training of school teachers.



We have till date screened about 7 lakh school children. After screening, we provide vision glasses with plastic lens in a frame chosen by the children themselves concerned with treatable refractive errors, free of charge. Similarly, children requiring further intervention – either medical or surgical too are given treatment free of charge, by utilising our own funds and with the contributions from state run schemes and generous assistance from various donors.

Further, as a part of this on-going program, we also make efforts to identify the specific children with cataract, glaucoma, corneal opacity, lid defects, strabismus (squint), nystagmus, retinoblastoma, cleft lip etc., and provide necessary treatment. We could also mobilise support from Dr Richard Hertle, world renowned Paediatric Ophthalmologist from Akron, Ohio, USA, to spare time to come to our Institute, year after year since 2011 and conduct surgeries for nystagmus, through the good offices of our Chairman Dr V.K. Raju,

In the ensuing years we recognized the need for comprehensive paediatric eye care to meet the needs of this special population. We have recruited Clinicians with special expertise in paediatric eye care management. A special outpatient clinic has been established for these paediatric patients because parent education and training is also essential for the paediatric cases.

Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP)

It is reported that over 3.5 million preterm infants are born in India annually. Improved neonatal care increased the survival of these preterm infants and hence increased the incidence of retinopathy of prematurity (ROP). ROP is the leading cause of infant blindness in India. Timely screening and treatment can prevent ROP-related blindness. However, ROP specialists to screen these preterm infants are few, particularly in rural areas where the majority of the preterm



babies are born. With over 60% of the Indian population living in rural areas, lack of universal screening of all the pre-term babies continues to contribute to ROP related blindness burden. The availability of digital wide-angled fundus camera and information technology have made application of telemedicine in ROP screening possible. SUNDROP, e-ROP, and KIDROP studies have validated the safety and efficacy of telemedicine in ROP screening.


The "GEMROP" Project

We, at Goutami Eye Institute, initiated a telemedicine based screening of ROP called GEMROP (Goutami Eye Tele Medicine Retinopathy Of Prematurity) in 2015. Under this project, ROP screening is done by a trained technician with a wide angled retinal camera. The images obtained are sent to a remote ROP specialist via the Internet. The treatment and follow-up protocols are determined by the remote ROP specialist. All the images are analysed and classified according to International Classification of Retinopathy of Prematurity (ICROP) group guidelines. The Early Treatment for Retinopathy of Prematurity Cooperative Group (ETROP) guidelines are followed to determine the premature infants who require treatment. Currently we are catering to few neonatal centres of East Godavari, West Godavari, Krishna, Prakasam, Nellore, Kadapa, Anantapur, Kurnool and Chittoor districts of Andhra Pradesh. We have also extended GEMROP in Kolkata region, in association with Rotary Club, Calcutta & Priyamvada Birla Eye Hospital, Kolkata and also Nepal in association with the Eastern Regional Eye Care Program / Biratnagar Eye Hospital, recently. From the initiation of the project in 2015 till December 2021 we have screened 10736 babies and treated 856 babies in Andhra Pradesh. In addition, screened 2,125 babies and treated 310 in Kolkota during 2020 -2021 and screened 304 babies and treated 9 babies in Nepal during 2021.

All the babies who were screened and were treated had a favourable outcome.

In developing countries like India with few ROP specialists, ROP screening by an ophthalmic technician employing telemedicine seems to be a valuable and effective option to prevent ROP-related blindness.


